



## FAQ

**Q: Who has to be licensed?**

A: Any vendor who supplies any gaming equipment (as defined by the ordinance) must be licensed. No exemption exists for gaming vendors; they must all be licensed. If you are a non-gaming vendor who does at least \$300,000 in business with the casino in a year, you also must be licensed (unless you are granted a licensing exemption).

**Q: Who has to be registered?**

A: The Gun Lake Tribal Gaming Commission no longer requires registration.

**Q: Are there licensing exemptions available?**

A: Yes, contact casino purchasing for details of available exemptions.

**Q: What happens if I am not licensed but then exceed \$300,000 in business with the casino annually?**

A: Unless you are eligible for an exemption you must become licensed in order to continue to do business with the casino.

**Q: Who makes the determination of whether an exemption is available?**

A: The Gaming Commission makes this determination. The casino can request an exemption on your behalf, but the Commission makes the determination.

**Q: What does getting a license entail?**

A: Your Company must submit a vendor license application and pay the licensing fee. In addition, some individuals must complete individual license applications and pay those fees. The details of who must be individually licensed are found in the vendor application.

**Q: I'm confused: vendor license, individual license, what's the difference?**

A: A vendor license is granted to a company. An individual license is granted to an individual. All employees of the Gun Lake Casino must hold active individual gaming licenses; in addition, some employees of a vendor also require individual gaming licenses. At the very least, the company principle(s) require individual licenses, as do any vendor employees with access to gaming areas.

**Q: How long does it take to become licensed?**

A: The time varies depending on the complexity of the required background checks.

**Q: Can I request a temporary license?**

A: Yes. You may request a temporary license that, if granted, allows you to start doing business while the background checks are conducted. The Commission always requires your application and fee to be submitted before a temporary license is granted.
